RALPH M. BROWN ACT

54954.2. (a) At least 72 hours before a regular meeting, the legislative body of the local agency, or its designee, shall post an agenda containing a brief general description of each item of business to be transacted or discussed at the 5 meeting, including items to be discussed in closed session. A brief general description of an item generally need not exceed 20 words. The agenda shall specify the time and location of the regular meeting and shall be posted in a location that is freely accessible to members of the public. If requested, the agenda shall be made available in appropriate alternative formats to persons with a disability, as required by Section 202 of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. Sec. 12132), and the federal rules and regulations adopted in implementation thereof. The agenda shall include information regarding how, to whom, and when a request for disability-related modification or accommodation, including auxiliary aids or services may be made by a person with a disability who requires a modification or accommodation in order to participate in the public meeting.

REMOVAL WARNING

In the event that any meeting is willfully interrupted by a group or groups of persons so as to render the orderly conduct of such meeting unfeasible and order cannot be restored y the removal of individuals who are willfully interrupting the meeting, the members of the legislative body conducting the meeting may order the meeting room cleared and continue in session. 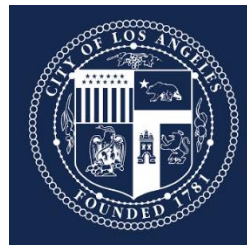
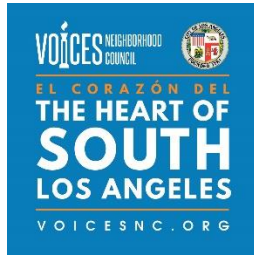

While Neighborhood Council board members are volunteers, they are public officials elected by the members of their community. CANNDU NC board members serve four-year terms.

who can run or vote?

Unlike other municipal, state, or federal elections, Neighborhood Council elections are open to anyone who is part of the fabric of daily life in a community. This includes those who live, work, or own property or a business there.

Also included are "community interest stakeholders" who have an ongoing, substantial involvement within a Council's boundaries, such as students of a school or members of a church.

Voters and board members need not be US citizens or legal residents to qualify. Participation is also open to the formerly incarcerated. Minimum age to vote or run for office in CANNDU NC is 18.

No es obligatorio que los votantes y los miembros de la junta sean ciudadanos estadounidenses o residentes legales para calificar. La condición de expresidente no constituye impedimento para participar en los consejos. La edad mínima para votar o postularse como candidato en CANNDU NC es de 18 años.

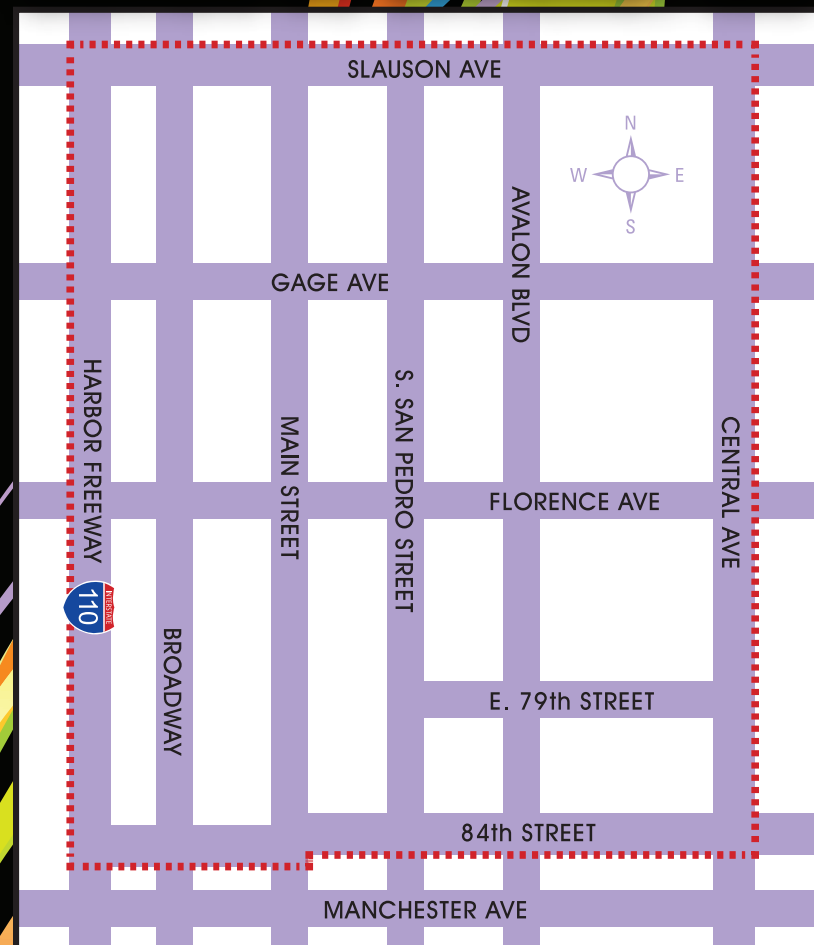
