Task force is checking auto shops for stolen vehicles and batteries, suggests engraving info. 15 crimes - 7 assaults including (2 aggravated assaults with firearms). 12 crimes - mostly GTA (127 this year) and aggravated assaults (161 this year). Fires near homeless encampments is an issue. Reminder that vehicles may be impounded for violations. SLO Lopez 12 crimes, mostly prostitution. Vehicles in this area may be impounded for violations starting 10/15/20. SLO Salavar aggravated assault, mostly domestic violence. GTA is up, theft of work trucks is up. Graffiti removal is being done in this area.

Public Officials Report - Britney Johnson from CD 9, thanks VNC for participation in food give away. Planning another food giveaway for Thanksgiving. Reiterates that vehicles will be towed for violations, sweeps to take place next week. Jaime asks if speed bumps are coming to Vermont Square Park, Brittney can't confirm or deny. Albert asks about overflowing trash at Vermont Square Park and Julian Dixon Park, Brittney attributes it to the activities of our unhoused neighbors and says that they are coordinating with the appropriate agency to have that addressed.

Stephen Wesson from USC swesson@usc.edu 323-240-3232, regarding Covid 19, the school reopened in August with a limited number of onsite classes and limited on-campus living. Unexpected spike of cases, in spite of testing

and contact tracing efforts. Tested over 20,000 students since August. Working with city health agencies to improve practices. USC football will resume without fans present, there will be a media day for the game with a heavy police presence, including plain clothes officers. Neighborhood Prosecutor, Nichole Butler nichole.butler@lacity.org, says to reach out if 311 is not responding quickly enough to bulky item removal. Sonia Lopez from the Office of Senator Holly Mitchell, no news to report. Edith Vega from the Mayor's Office, mobile Covid testing throughout South LA, offering flu shots in partnership with USC, working with CORE to develop one-stop-shop for covid testing, flu shots, food distribution and other resources. will send flyer for dissemination to communities to register for food giveaways. Updates on Census, no date at the moment, will provide an update when available. Albert requests Sonia to advocate for the Voices area for a collaboration with GRID. Alberts asks about the CARE team, Sonia says the office is looking into lifting legislation that would allow more "comprehensive" clean-ups.

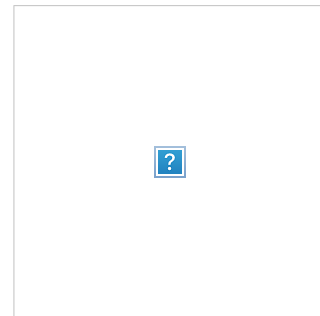




