Senior Services	The Senior Services Committee addresses the needs of senior citizens in the community and provides an environment where seniors can discuss current issues, share ideas and voice their concerns. The committee will be supportive of programs and services that provide seniors with maximum vitality and independence. It will identify, monitor and address issues that have impact upon seniors' quality of life. The committee will promote "Healthy Aging" by creating an environment where individual differences and needs are recognized; by promoting multicultural awareness, understanding and interaction; and by serving as a bridge to access government information and resources.
5. Youth & Education	The Youth & Education Committee addresses the issues, concerns, programs and services related to the education of children, youth and adults and developing specific strategies and policies for influencing and achieving constructive outcomes within schools, classrooms, and other education/learning centers that serve the Voices community. Additionally, this committee has the general responsibility to discuss issues, foster collaboration on projects, and brainstorm ideas to encourage greater community involvement/support and participation.
6. Health & Safety	The Health & Safety Committee seeks opportunities to organize and forums to mobilize the community in seeking safety practices. This includes partnering with Neighborhood Watch, Volunteer Safety Task Force (to enhance the Services provided by the School Crossing Guards), School Crossing Guards, Los Angeles Police Department Senior Lead Officers and Traffic Division and the Los Angeles Fire Department. Representatives of VNC will work to formalize a relationship with these City agencies and other entities responsible for "safety issues" in our community.

The Voices Neighborhood Council held a General Board Meeting on March 14, 2023 and voted (TK-TK-TK) to SUPPORT the renovation project at 4270 S. Vermont Ave. The long time owner of the existing self service car wash and Boba Tea store desires to renovate the site into a modern convenience store, with a gasoline station behind the store, and a "drive into" car wash behind the gasoline station (at the back of the property).

After hearing about the project at our Planning and Land Use Committee Meeting on February 21, 2023, we were particularly impressed by the plans to put the convenience store at the front of the property, at the sidewalk (rather than at the back of the property with the pumps in front). We also appreciated the placing of a drive-in car wash along the Vermont corridor. There is no gas station/car wash along Vermont within our boundaries at this time.

The aesthetics of having the gas station and car wash in the middle and rear, and the store along the sidewalk was particularly innovative.

Our only thought (after we met with Mr. Michael Pauls, the owner's representative) was that we would like the owner to consider installing a Level 3 DC fast charger in one of the parking spaces that is in the plans. There are NO such chargers within two miles in any direction. Having the charger in the gas station would provide convenience for EV owners in the area, as well as EV owners who might be traveling on the Harbor Freeway (110). There are currently no Level 3 chargers south of downtown for approximately 18 miles. So we hope the owner will consider partnering with a company such as EVGo, Chargepoint or Electrify America who would provide equipment, expertise and upkeep for such a charger. It would create an additional revenue stream for the owner while providing a valuable service for our area.


